3. Sector(s) and area(s) of specialization

The planned activities are linked to the project Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) Programme In Romania 2024 – 2026. IOM Romania is seeking to partner with a non-governmental organization to implement activities that are linked with the programme to contribute to strengthen Romania's comprehensive migration management through right-based, safe and dignified voluntary returns of migrants and support sustainable reintegration.

5. Project Background

The International Organization for Migration (IOM), the UN agency for migration has been present in Romania since 1992 and is playing a key role in operating in areas related to integration and social inclusion of migrants, Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration, Relocation and resettlement of refugees, Fight against trafficking in human beings etc.

IOM Romania aims to contribute to strengthen Romania's comprehensive migration management through rights-based, safe and dignified voluntary returns within the Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) programme. This programme is an indispensable part of a comprehensive approach to migration management aiming at orderly and humane return and reintegration of migrants who are unable or unwilling to remain in the host countries and thus wish to voluntarily return to their countries of origin.

6. Expected Results

The purpose of this Call for Expression of Interest is to screen and identify suitable partners that have the capacity to provide assistance to migrants legally residing in Romania. All the activities will be realized in close coordination with IOM in Romania.

As one of IOM's core activities, the Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) programme supports third country nationals (TCN) who choose to return home voluntarily. IOM Romania has been supporting migrants to return to their countries of origin for over two decades.

The expected results are:

- Strengthening the outreach and broadening the understanding of AVRR among migrants and other stakeholders, so that migrants in need of return support are aware of the support available and able to make an informed decision.
- Assisting migrants willing to return voluntarily and contribute to their sustainable reintegration, considering the economic, social and psychosocial dimensions thereof and,
- Promoting and facilitating cooperation among key stakeholders, including local county and central structures of the General Inspectorate for Immigration (GII), Border Police, media, Embassies of third countries in Romania, NGOs, migrant communities, in support of AVRR.

Expression of Interest submission guidelines

This document contains instructions on the preparation and submission of the Application.

- 1. The Application must be submitted through email at <u>iombucarest@iom.int</u> no later than 7 March 2024. Late Application will no longer be considered.
- 2. A detailed description must be provided on how the requirements specified in the Call for Expression of Interest (CEI) issued by IOM will be matched by the capabilities, experience, knowledge and expertise of the Implementing Partners.
- 3. The email subject shall be indicated with the **reference number RO/February/CEI-01** and the name of the Applicant.
- 4. The Application must be submitted in the English language, Annex-D in English and in the format prescribed by IOM within the CEI. All required information must be provided, responding clearly and concisely to all the points set out. Any application which does not fully and comprehensively address this CEI requirements may be rejected.

- 5. The Application document should comprise of the following:
 - a. Cover Letter;
 - b. Duly accomplished application documentation as outlined within the CEI signed on all pages by the prospective Implementing Partner's Authorized Representative; and
 - c. Any other relevant documents
- 6. Applications may be modified or withdrawn in writing, prior to the closing time specified in this Request for EoI. Applications shall not be modified or withdrawn after the deadline.
- 7. The Implementing partner shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of the Application and IOM will not in any case be responsible and liable for the costs incurred.
- 8. IOM at no occasion will ask an application fee from Implementing Partners.
- 9. Partners can use IOM's We Are All In platform for reporting fraud, corruption or misconduct.
- 10. All information given in writing to or verbally shared with the Implementing Partners in connection with this CEI is to be treated as strictly confidential. The Implementing Partner shall not share or invoke such information to any third party without the prior written approval of IOM. This obligation shall continue after the selection process has been completed whether or not the Implementing Partner application is successful.
- 11. IOM will treat all information (or that marked proprietary/sensitive/financial) received from Implementing Partners as confidential and any personal data in accordance with its Data Protection Principles.
- 12. The Implementing Partner, by submitting an application, gives consent to IOM to share information with those who need to know for the purposes of evaluating and managing the proposal.
